Did you know that in 2014, a San Clemente City Councilman's viewing of "Sunday Morning" had a profound effect on our community? The TV special described an existing program called The Village which supported 55 and older individuals as they aged, with emphasis on providing essential services so that continuing to live in their own homes was possible. Our Councilman approached the City's Human Affairs

Committee about the possibility of "a village" in San Clemente and found immediate interest in the idea. First, Steering Committee members surveyed over 300 locals to ask about this need in the City. The area's churches and non- profit groups concurred with those surveyed: A Village was definitely needed in San Clemente. The City supported the concept's formation with a start-up grant in 2015.

Hard- working founding members established the groundwork and decided on types of services Volunteers would provide to Members. Volunteers were recruited and trained, Members signed up, and the concept of "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" became a reality.

In a little over two years, with non-profit status, SC Village has 64 Members, 73 Volunteers, a Board of Directors, an Advisory Board, an Executive Director, supporting sponsors, and a newsletter. In 2018, SC Village fulfilled an astounding number of service requests from Members and sponsored numerous successful social and educational events.

#### San Clemente Village Elects Officers

In early December, the Village Board of Directors elected a slate of officers for 2018-2019.



**Bob Coff**, who has served as Treasurer of the Board since our inception, will now be the President. He has a long history with the Village and was one of the first residents to support the idea of forming a Village. Everyone is so appreciative of Bob for keeping a watchful over the Village's finances the past three years. Bob retired from his own business, a mobile auto

body shop. Prior to that, Bob was Vice President of Excelsis, the first company to put fuel cell engines into Daimler Chrysler and Ford automobiles.



**Bob Spidell** is the newly elected Vice President and is one of the original founding members of San Clemente Village. He has lived in San Clemente since 1999. In the mid-1970s, Bob founded Spidell Publishing, Inc., which became the largest privately- owned provider of tax information in California. Bob has a BA in Economics and an Honorary D.H.L. from California State

University, Long Beach. He is a former President of the CSULB Alumni Association, the Mission San Juan Capistrano Docent Society and the California Society of Tax Consultants.




