

#### Geneva Matlock



Hi Villagers,

I have known Geneva for over five years. Here's some information about this fantastic lady.

Geneva was born in Paducah, Kentucky in 1925. She was raised on a farm that was at one time a tobacco farm. They had pigs, cows, chickens. They grew raspberries and had multiple fruit trees, so Geneva know how to make great jams and jellies. She grew up with 3 siblings. Her mother was a widowed German immigrant and came to the US to start a new life with 2 children. She married Geneva's father and they welcomed 2 more children.

Geneva started college in 1942 and married in 1943. She continued college while her husband was drafted into the Navy during WWII. One of her jobs was working for the Board of Education in Paducah but quit after a few months because they would not pay her what they had been paying her male predecessor. After Melvin returned home, he went back to his job on the railroad but then they bought some property and opened a laundromat and Melvin resigned from the railroad. Their business was successful.

Geneva and Melvin went to medical school to become Anesthesiologists. At school there were 100 male students and only 4 female students, one of which was Geneva. They moved to Ogden, Utah and opened a private practice in 1963. They divorced and Geneva moved to CA in 1973. She worked at Hoag Newport Beach and had a successful private practice. She met Ed her second husband and continued her extensive travel of the world and also became well versed in sailing in Newport Beach.

She enjoys a good meal of roast beef and mashed potatoes. Geneva has all the James Michener books and loves reading and learning about other places in the world. She was playing Bridge several times a week before Covid-19 and misses it and her friends quite a bit. She also likes reading the paper every morning with her cup of coffee. Something that might surprise you about Geneva is that she played tennis until she was 85 years old. Geneva learned about San Clemente Village from one of her friends who had joined the Village and was happy with the service that they were providing.
